LO: To locate the Alps on a map. Success Criteria: I can locate and label the seven continents. I can locate the Alps on a world map. I can locate the Alps on a map of Europe. I can locate the eight countries that the Alps are in. Main Event: Children are to locate the Alps on a map using atlases. Also mark on the eight countries that the Alps spreads through. Support: Should use the Activity: World map (support version); could label four countries where the Alps are located on the Activity: Where are the Alps? Challenge: Should also label the closest seas to the Alps – the Adriatic Sea and the Mediterranean Sea.	<ul> <li>LO: To locate the key physical and human characteristics of the Alps.</li> <li>Success Criteria: I can locate the countries that the Alps spread through.</li> <li>I can locate some of the key physical features of the Alps.</li> <li>I can locate some of the key human features of the Alps.</li> <li>I can locate some of the key human features of the Alps.</li> <li>I can use an atlas to locate and describe features.</li> <li>Main Event: Using the interactive map children are to construct the jigsaw of the Alps. Once completed glue the map individually onto paper.</li> <li>Children to use activity sheet and label different items based on their maps.</li> <li>Support: Could use the Activity: The Alps jigsaw (support) to cut and stick the labelled pieces to create a map of The Alps.</li> <li>Challenge: Could write a short description for each image; could use the link: Google Earth to locate and add their own features to their maps using symbols.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>LO: To describe the physical and human features of an Alpine region.</li> <li>Success Criteria: I can research the human and physical geography of an Alpine region. I can identify the region's climate zone, biome and vegetation. I can describe land use in the region.</li> <li>Main Event: Children are focusing on Innsbruck in the Alps. Children are to research Innsbruck and write a paragraph describing why people visit there.</li> <li>Support: Should use the Activity: Why do people visit the Alps? (support version) with a word bank.</li> <li>Challenge: Could use their research to write six questions and answers for their partner in the 'Slopes and lifts' game in the Wrapping up section.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>LO: To investigate what there is to do in the local area using data collection.</li> <li>Success Criteria: I can use an OS map to recognise key physical and human features in the local area.</li> <li>I can draw symbols to map recreational land use in the local area.</li> <li>I can say how I would like to improve the things to do in the local area.</li> <li>Main Event: Class are going to go a local walk today to look at what we have in the local area.</li> <li>Children to work in groups and map out what we have in a given area local to our school.</li> <li>Support: May need support working out where they are on the OS map, by, for example, identifying features around them that they can recognise on the map.</li> <li>Challenge: Could consider the limitations of the data collection methods (for example, only taken at a particular time of day or year when fewer people are visiting the area).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>LO: To understand similarities and differences between the local area and an Alpine area.</li> <li>Success Criteria: I can compare the human geography of the local area with an Alpine area.</li> <li>I can compare the physical geography of the local area with an Alpine area.</li> <li>I can identify similarities and differences between the two areas.</li> <li>Main Event: Children are going to use information from the previous lesson and lesson 3 and compare the local area and the Alps. Children are to produce a slide show about how we could improve the local area.</li> <li>Support: Could use the word bank on the Activity: How is Innsbruck different from our local area? (support).</li> <li>Challenge: Should use the correct geographical vocabulary to describe the similarities and differences between the location, climate, vegetation, population, transport and leisure of both areas.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>LO: To understand the human and physical geography of the Alps.</li> <li>Success Criteria: I can describe two key aspects of the Alps' human geography. I can describe two key aspects of the Alps' physical geography.</li> <li>I can use geographical vocabulary when describing the geography of a place.</li> <li>Main Event: On sticky notes children are to write down what they have learnt about the Alps. Children are to make a brochure advertising the Alps.</li> <li>Support: Should use Activity: What is life like in the Alps? (support) with subheadings for each section.</li> <li>Challenge: Could include more than four key aspects of the human and physical geography of the Alps. Could include information about climate change under the heading 'Responsible tourism'.</li> </ul>



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
